Canada's Charter of Rights and Freedoms guarantees the rights and freedoms set forth in this matter under reasonable restrictions imposed by the law, only that can demonstrate legitimacy in a free and democratic society. At the time of actual war or arrest, invasion or insurgency, the House of Commons may continue by parliament and the Legislature may continue by the Legislature for more than five years if such continuity is not opposed to the votes of the Legislature or the Legislature, more than a third, since such cases may be (82) edge notes: annual sitting of the Legislature<sup>5</sup>. There will be a sitting of each parliament and of the legislature at least every twelve months (83) add notes: Public mobility<sup>6</sup>. (2) All Canadian citizens and anyone with the status of permanent resident of Canada have the right (a) to move and take residence in any province; and (b) to pursue a livelihood in any province; (3) the rights specified in the sub-section, (2) are subject to the laws or practices of general application applicable in any province other than discrimination between the provinces; And (b) any law that provides the appropriate residency requirements as a qualification for social services to public services, (4) subsections (2) and (3) do not impede any legal program or activity that is the object of amelioration in the province of conditions of a person in a province at a social or economic disadvantage if the employment rate in that province is lower than the employment rate in Canada. Edge Note: The life, freedom and safety of the person<sup>7</sup> of all people have the right to life, liberty and stability of the person, and the right not to be deprived of such except in accordance with the principles of basic justice. Edge Note: Find or fasten <sup>8</sup> of everyone has the right to be with unreasonable searches or seizures. Add-on Notes: Detention or Imprisonment<sup>9</sup>. Everyone has the right not to be detained or arbitrarily detained. (b) to maintain and advise without delay and to be notified of that right, and (c) to ensure the validity of detention imposed by habeas corpus and will be released if the detention is not lawful. Add-on Notes: Criminal and Punitive Action<sup>11</sup>. (b) to attempt within a reasonable time; (e) to be presumed innocent until proven guilty by the law in a fair and impartial trial by an independent and impartial court; f) Except in cases where a military offense is tried before a military court for the sake of a trial by a jury, the maximum penalty for an offense is imprisoned for five years or has a more severe punishment; It is an offence under Canadian or international law or as a criminal based on the general principles of the law recognized by the community of the country;(h) And (j) if found guilty of an offence, and if the penalty for the offence is varied between the time of the commission and the time of the punishment for the sake of less punishment. Add-on Notes: Treatment or Punishment<sup>12</sup>. Everyone has the right not to receive cruel and unusual treatment or punishment. Edge note: The self-crimination<sup>13</sup> of any witness who testifies in the prosecution has the right to have no evidence of any allegation, so let's ever accuse the witness in other litigation except in litigation for intimidation or for providing conflicting evidence. Profit Note: Interpreter<sup>14</sup>. Any party or witness in the prosecution who does not understand or speak the language of the prosecution or the deaf have the right to assist the interpreter. (1) All people are equal before and legally and have the right to equal protection and equal benefits of the law without discrimination and in particular, without discrimination based on race, national or ethnic, color, religion, gender, age or mental or physical disability. (1) English or French is the official language of Canada and the equality of status and equal rights and privileges in their use in all institutions of the Parliament and the Government of Canada of (2) English and French as the official language of Brunswick and there is equality of status and equal rights and privileges in their use in all of the legislatures and governments of New Brunswick (3). The power of parliament or legislature to advance the equality of status or the use of English and French. Marginal note: English and French communities in New Brunswick 16.1 (1) The English and French communities in New Brunswick have equal rights and privileges, including the rights of different institutions and different cultural institutions, such as those necessary for the preservation and promotion of those communities. (1) Everyone has the right to use English or French in any discussion and other actions of the Parliament of (86) (2) everyone has the right to use English or French in any discussion and other proceedings of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick. (88) (2) The law, notes and journals of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick will be printed and published in English and French, and both versions of the language have equal authority. (89) Marginal Note: Any court proceeding established by the 19th Parliament of (1) either English or French may be used by any person in, or in any plea in or the process of leaving, any court established by the Parliament of (90) (2) either English or French may be used by any party in, or in any plea in or the process of leaving, any court of New Brunswick. (1) Members of the public in Canada have the right to communicate with, and will receive existing services from, the head or any central office of the Institution of Parliament or the Government of Canada in English or French, and have the same rights regarding other offices of such institutions. or (b) because the nature of the office is reasonable that communication and services from the office are available in both English and All members of the public in New Brunswick have the right to communicate with and receive services available from any office of the Institute of The Legislative Assembly or the Government of New Brunswick in English or French. Nothing in Section 16 to 20 abrogates or derogates from any privileged rights or obligations relating to English and French, or either available or continued by relying on other provisions of the Canadian Constitution (92) Profit Notes:Rights and Privileges Preserved.<sup>22</sup>. Nothing in Section 16 to 20 abrogates or derogates from any legal or customary rights or privileges granted or enjoyed either before or after the effective use of this Charter concerning any language other than English or French.Marginal note:Language of teaching<sup>23</sup> (1) Citizen of Canada (a) who has the first language learned and still understands is the English or French minority population of the province where they live, or (b) who receive elementary school instruction in Canada, in English or French, and live in the province where they are mandated as the language of the English or French minority population of the province. They are entitled to have their children taught primary and secondary school in that language in that province. (93) (2) Citizens of Canada whose children receive or receive primary or secondary school guidance in English or French in Canada have the right to give their children. (3) the rights of citizens in Canada under subsections (1) and (2) to provide their children with primary and secondary instruction in the language of the english or French minority population of the province.(b) and (b) including the number of those children, so the warrant warrants that will be granted in the ethnic minority language schools provided out of public funds. Incremental Notes: Enforcement of rights and freedoms guaranteed 24. Add-on Notes: Aboriginal rights and Not affected by charter<sup>25</sup> The warranty in this Charter of Certain Rights and Freedoms shall not be construed in order to be abrogate or derogate from the Aboriginal Treaty or other rights or freedoms relating to The Aboriginal People of Canada, including (a) any rights or freedoms recognized by the Declaration of the Royal Family on 7 October 1763; Add-on notes: Rights and other freedoms that are not affected by Charter<sup>26</sup>, the warranty in the Charter of Certain Rights and Freedoms shall not be construed as a denial of the existence of rights or other freedoms contained in Canada. This Charter is construed in a manner consistent with the preservation and optimization of the cultural heritage of Canadians.Marginal note:Equally guaranteed rights to both sexes.<sup>28</sup> Despite what is in this Charter, the rights and freedoms cited in it are equally guaranteed to male and female individuals. Add-on note: The right to respect some schools preserved <sup>29</sup>. Nothing in this charter abrogates or derogates from any rights or privileges guaranteed by or under the Canadian Constitution in respect of segregated or offensive denomination schools. (95) Edge Note: Application to 30 territories and territories. References in this Charter to the province or legislature or the legislature of the province shall be deemed to include references to the Yukon and Northwest territories or appropriate legislative powers as is the case. Edge Note: Legislative power does not extend 31. Nothing in this Charter extends the legislative powers of any body or authority. Additional Notes: The application of Charter 32. (1) This Charter applies(a) to the Parliament and the Government of Canada in respect of all matters within the power of parliament, including all matters relating to the Yukon and Northwest territories; (2) Even with a subsection(1), Section 15 will not take effect until three years after this section takes effect. Add-ons: Quick Publish exceptions 33. The legislature or the legislature of the province may expressly declare in the Act of Parliament or of the Legislature, as is the case that such act or provision shall be implemented despite the provisions included in Section 2 or Section 7 through 15 of this Charter. The Act or provisions of the Act in respect of the section declared under this section shall be in effect, such action shall be taken as it will be, but only for the provisions of this Charter referred to in the declaration.
